

#### waste generated by our society. Today in Europe, each habitant generates, in average, 0.5 tonnes of municipal urban biorefinery solid waste per year, increasing at an annual rate of 10%.

Around 40-50% of it correspond to organic waste. The URBIOFIN project demonstrates the techno-economic and environmental viability of an integrated biorefinery for the transformation of the organic fraction of municipal solid waste into new marketable bioproducts, chemical building blocks, biopolymers and additives.
